


and 90% have less than 5 points

The simple fact is we're not using the full range of our current points system:

Status distribution: 2007, sweep-oar only

The proposed new scheme begins to remedy that imbalance with two simple steps:

1. Every win is a qualifying win

This measure alone will DOUBLE the number of points won at regattas in a season, and over time will even out the distribution of people across the points table. There will be some exceptions, but the principle is simple:

win a pot, win a point

This approach will be reinforced by topping up the points of winners in Henley events - both at the Royal Regatta and the Women's Regatta. This is in line with the existing practice of topping up international gold medallists, and recognises that a Henley medallist really ought to be racing at Senior or Elite level.

2. Simplify the status system

Create 4 distinct racing categories:

Elite Senior Intermediate (3 levels) Novice

This scheme still uses a 12-point scale, and there are still 6 racing categories. But they're simply spread out more evenly across the points range.

The new category names help to differentiate them from the existing scheme, but will also restore pride in moving up through the points table. We want competitors once again to

What next?
